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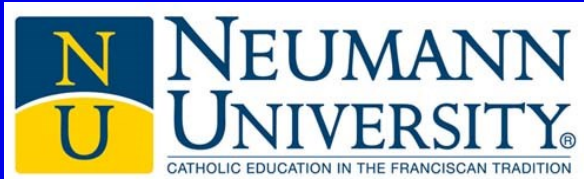

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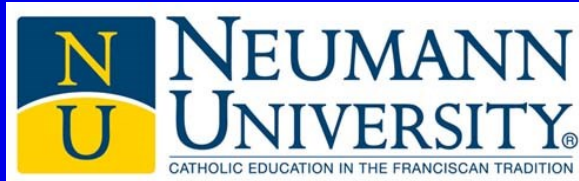
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Faculty Highlights

New Director of the Master of Science in Sport and Entertainment Management Program

We welcome to Neumann University, Dr. Douglas Michele Turco. Professor Turco comes to Neumann from Arcadia University, where he served as Associate Dean of the College of Global Studies. He brings an extensive record of successful national and international experience as a scholar, professor and administrator to his work at Neumann University including prior appointments at Drexel, DeSales and Illinois State University.

Dr. Turco has authored over 40 articles in journals including *Sport Marketing Quarterly*, *International Journal of Sport Management*, *Journal of Travel Research and the Journal of Sport and Tourism*, and has written several books: *Sport Tourism*, *Sport and Event Marketing*, and *Assessing the Economic Impact of Parks and Recreation Special Events*.

New Director of the Doctorate in Education Program

We welcome to Neumann University Dr. Lorraine A. Cavaliere. Professor Cavaliere served as the Founding Dean of the School of Education at Gwynedd-Mercy College. As a specialist in learning and cognition as well as adult learning behavior, she developed curriculum and courses uniquely suited for students majoring in education and teacher preparation programs at the graduate and undergraduate levels.

Prior to Gwynedd-Mercy College Dr. Cavaliere was Dean of Adult and Continuing Education at Cabrini College where she was responsible for the academic programs and support services provided to adult students through bachelor degrees, certificate programs, professional development courses and summer session. 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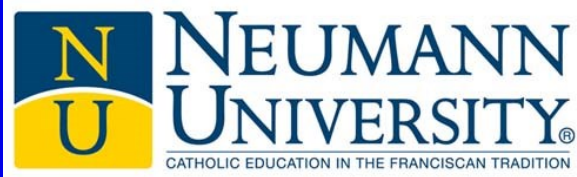
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Information Session on Tuesday, October 1 Undergraduate and Graduate Programs for Adults

Undergraduate Options for Adult Learners

B.S. in Professional Studies is a business-oriented degree, with eight-week courses on weeknights; B.S. or B.A. in Liberal Studies with semester-long courses (worth six credits each) taken either in class or online; B.A. in Behavioral Science provides a foundation in the study of psychology and the behavioral sciences; B.S. in Organizational Leadership provides a foundational knowledge of a business environment with specific emphasis on leadership.

Traditional Evening Programs in Accounting, Business, and Nursing including an accelerated R.N. to B.S. program.

Healthcare Programs: Medical Assistant, Pharmacy Technician, Phlebotomy, and Physical Therapy Aide.

Graduate Studies

M.S. in Accounting with emphasis in Fraud and Forensics (provides academic credit to pursue CPA designation); M.S. in Education (multiple locations); M.S. in Nursing (Adult-Gerontology Primary Care Nurse Practitioner program); M.S. in Organizational and Strategic Leadership (18-month program available in class or online); M.S. in Pastoral Care and Counseling (blends psychology and spirituality); M.S. in Sport and Entertainment Management (18 month program hybrid or online).

The Ed.D. program meets the needs of professional educators featuring convenient schedules and small classes; Physical Therapy – Earn an entry level DPT in a weekend, on-campus program that's accredited by CAPTE; Ph.D. in Pastoral Counseling-Hybrid (in class and online) weekend format; academic and clinical hours can be applied toward state licensure and professional credentialing.

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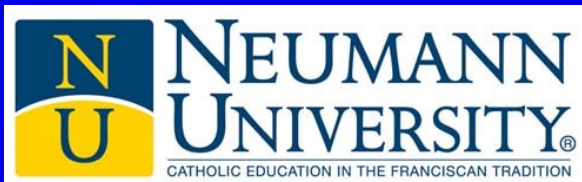
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New Academic Offering

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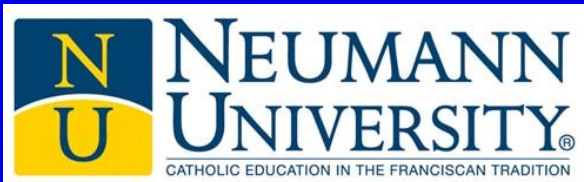
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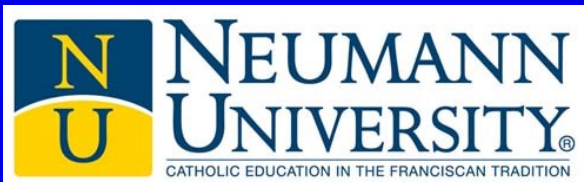
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Alpha Omega Nu
