

THE CUBBIE: A NEW TOOL FOR STRESS AND ANXIETY RELIEF - A RESEARCH INITIATIVE AT NEUMANN

Neumann University has introduced Cubbie, an immersive sensory regulation booth designed to help individuals manage stress and anxiety in under 10 minutes. Installed in Bachmann Hall, this high-tech booth uses music, video, and lighting to create a personalized sensory experience. Originally developed for neurodivergent individuals, Cubbie benefits anyone feeling overwhelmed or unfocused. Dr. Jenelle Abnett, an expert in autism and neurodiversity, highlights its usefulness in high-pressure situations like exams, while Dr. Tiffeny Atkins, a faculty member specializing in physical

therapy, emphasizes its role in $soldsymbol{t}$ pporting student well-being across academics, athletics, and social interactions.

Beyond its immediate benefits, Cubbie is part of a larger research initiative led by Abnett and Atkins in collaboration with its creators, David and Jon McIntyre. Neumann plans to partner with 8-10 school districts in 2025-26 to study Cubbie's impact on student focus and classroom behavior, aiming to replicate Ireland's success in reducing disruptions by 60% and increasing participation by 90%. The program is customizable, with occupational therapists tailoring the experience to individual needs. To support this initiative, Neumann's University Advancement team is raising funds for installation and research costs. Already widely used in Ireland and the UK, Cubbie has the potential to transform stress management in American schools. Ben, a junior majoring in Finance with a minor in Business Administration, is a dedicated member of both the Men's Ice Hockey and Lacrosse teams at Neumann. He credits athletics for instilling essential life skills: "Understanding how to maintain balance and time management are two things that athletics have instilled within me."

Choosing Neumann for its strong academic and athletic environment, Ben was drawn to "the sense of community...allowing me to develop meaningful relationships with my peers and professors." His favorite course, Finance 301, provided a foundation for his future, saying, "It was instrumental in ensuring I understand the fundamentals and can be successful in future internships."

Regarding his internship experience, Ben shares, "My previous internship was with Cassaday & Company, an independent wealth management firm located right outside of Washington, D.C. While at Cassaday, I assisted with account management and client

requests, sat in on and took notes for advisors in one-on-one meetings with clients, and completed a capstone presentation with my fellow interns by developing and presenting a comprehensive financial plan for a fictitious family to upper management. The importance of this internship cannot be overstated for me, as it was my first true experience in the financial realm, and provided reassurance that I was stepping into a field that I felt I would not only be effective in but would enjoy my line of work. Furthermore, the ability to build connections with and learn under experienced professionals was an invaluable experience, which taught me many elements that I might have been unable to learn at university."

Reflecting on his time at Neumann, he acknowledges Dr. Jeff Graber's mentorship, stating, "He has made a significant impact on my time at Neumann through the lessons of his own experiences prior to teaching. I feel that he has not only taught me relevant material but has used his own experiences to help explain why specific concepts are crucial and how they can be applied in one's own life. In addition, Dr. Graber has been someone that I feel I can discuss any questions I may have about events that I may encounter in my future something that has helped ease my nerves about uncertainties I have regarding the real world."

Ben expressed his appreciation of his family during his college years stating, "my family's support and guiding me throughout this incredible journey who have been my rock to lean on whenever I am flustered or feel drained from all that I have on my plate."

For Ben, the best part of Neumann has been the relationships he's built: "They often say, 'people make the place,' and that couldn't be any truer for my experience here."
